SEPTEMBER 10 | WEEK 48 | WORRY [PHILIPPIANS 4:6]

1. Have you ever bartered or traded an item or service with someone else? Did it turn out to be a good or bad trade?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

 On page 326-327, Mark Moore, in his book Core 52, describes "WORRY" as a "pandemic" that "stems from poor mental habits," something that "isn't merely a psychological problem; it's a theological problem," and "is toxic to our souls." As a group, discuss how overwhelming worry has the ability to lead to each of the five underlined word(s) above.

2. We discussed bartering with our first question. Look up the following verses and make two lists: 1) What does God want from us? and 2) What does God promise to give us in return? Do you think these are good trades? Philippians 4:6-7; John 14:27; Joshua 1:9; Isaiah 35:4; 2 Timothy 1:7

3. Read Matthew 6:25-34. Jesus lists a few things to not worry about. What are they? Why does God tell us not to worry? What does this teach us about God?

6. On page 330 (Core 52), Moore warns us that if we don't replace our fearful and negative thoughts with God's truth, it could leave a vacuum in its place. Read Philippians 4:8-9 and Galatians 5:22-23. What thoughts and behaviors can replace our worries? How would these help us fight worry?

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. If you are one who struggles with worry, what are some steps you could take this week to ease its grip on you?
- 2. If you know someone who suffers from worry, how could you help them this week?

1. Who outside of your immediate family had the most influence on you as a child?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. Read 2 Timothy 2:2. How would you define mentoring according to Paul's words in this passage?

2. Read Matthew 20:25-28. What would you say is the most important element in being a mentor?

3. What are some reasons people are hesitant to mentor?

4. Read Matthew 21:15-17. What was Jesus' motivation for being a mentor to Peter? How can we show this same love to those God brings to our path to mentor?

5. What is the most powerful tool God has given us to mentor others?
6. What happens when we mentor well by God's Word and His Spirit?
7. Which do you think is more important: having the right actions or the right motives? Which one is Jesus encouraging through the Sermon on the Mount?
CHANGE QUESTIONS 1. Who is someone God has placed in your life that you could be a mentor to?
2. Who is someone God has placed in your life that could be your mentor?

SEPTEMBER 24 | WEEK 50 | SCRIPTURE [2 TIMOTHY 3:16-17]

CONNECT QUESTION

1. What is something you tend to avoid because you don't know how to use it?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. Read 2 Timothy 3:14 -17. What do these verses tell us about God and His relationship to Scripture?

2. What do these verses tell us about what Scripture can do for us and our spiritual walk?

3. Read Hebrews 4:12. How is the word of God alive and active?

4. What does it mean that the Bible penetrates to the point of dividing soul and spirit? Have you ever experienced this?

5. One of the most effective ways to pray God's will and have Scripture penetrate into our soul and spirit is to pray Scripture. In the space below each verse, write a prayer back to God.

Philippians 2:1-4

Verse 1 - Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion,

Verse 2 - then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind.

Verse 3 - Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves,

Verse 4 - not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others

(Example Prayer) Heavenly Father, Help me to be like minded with the Holy Spirit. Help me to love who He loves and love what He loves. Help me to not only hear Him but do what he asks me to do or say or sometimes not say. Help me to check my ego at the door at work, with my family and friends and co-workers, as I do life. I have a tendency to be selfish, especially when I'm tired. Help me not to be that way. Help me to value all people no matter who they are or what their circumstances may be. We are all your children and need to be seen that way. I know I often seek my interest first but I know that is not your way. Help me to love people enough to put their interests before mine. OCTOBER 1 | WEEK 51 | GAINING GRIT [HEBREWS 12:1-2]

CONNECT QUESTION

1. When have you ever had to endure something for the greater good? When did you know going into a situation/issue that it was going to be difficult and long, but worth the effort?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. Read Hebrews 12:1-2. What are some striking terms that are used about one's faith and gaining grit? How do you think God views our faith journey in light of these verses?

2. Verse 1 speaks about a "great cloud of witnesses." Who is this describing? How is this significant with grit? How would a cloud of witnesses help us in our lives?

3. What actions do we need to take as we run this race of life?

4. In verse 2, Jesus is called the "pioneer and perfecter of our faith." In what ways can "fixing our eyes on him" help you gain grit in your life?
5. In Core 52, Mark Moore points out to gain grit, "First you look around to others you're responsible to and for. Second, you look ahead at the reward you'll reap through perseverance" (pg. 351). Why would this help us to gain grit?
CHANGE QUESTIONS
1. What changes do I need to make to gain grit in my life?
2. Read 2 Tim. 4:6-8. This is Paul's farewell statement; after this is written he is martyred for Christ. How does this inspire you? Challenge you?

CONNECT QUESTION

1. What does the thought of heaven bring to your mind?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. Read Rev. 21:1-5. What does this teach us about Heaven?

2. How does the description of this New Heaven and New Earth compare or contrast with our current circumstances on Earth?

3. Read Revelation 21:6-7. Who is going to heaven? How does someone get in?

4. Read Revelation 21:8. Is Hell a real place? Why do people question its existence?
5. Read Revelation 22:20. The early Christians were looking forward to heaven. Do you think one of the reasons we have become so indifferent toward evangelism is because we aren't as excited about the expectation for Heaven as the early church was? How could we change that?
CHANGE QUESTIONS
1. If Jesus were to sit down with you today, how do you believe he would talk about Heaven and use that as a focus for how to live?
2. Are there any steps that you need to take to be ready for eternity?
