At the end of the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew, Jesus tells the story of a wise man who built his house on the rock and a foolish man who built his house on the sand. Jesus spoke these words about all that he taught, "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. [Matthew 7:24]" Wise people build on solid foundations.

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE:

The purpose of this guide is to ignite a passion for the Bible in your daily life. God's Word is living, active, and useful for our lives...but so few Christians actually engage in it daily. We want to provide you with a resource that you can use on your own and with your Life Group to ignite and sustain this passion. We want to make God's Word our way.

SERMON NOTES:

Bring this workbook to church each Sunday. As you listen to the sermon, make a note when you hear something that surprises you, intrigues you, bothers you, challenges you, or encourages you.

CONNECT QUESTIONS:

These questions will help you and your group members become more comfortable with talking and sharing with each other. Not only will you learn more about one-another, the questions will help to steer the discussion in the direction of the topic.

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION:

These questions are the "meat" of the discussion and will point back to the sermon each week. Feel free to read and answer these questions before your group meets. They will also help you dig deeper into the Scriptures during your group discussions.

CHANGE QUESTIONS:

At the end of Jesus' most famous sermon, he says that if you do not put his words into practice then you are a fool [Matthew 7:24-27]. Life transformation is the ultimate goal of a follower of Christ. Feel free to answer these questions out-loud when your leader reads them or you can quietly reflect and write a response in your workbook.

PRAY FOR ONE-ANOTHER:

Please focus this time on *your own personal* praises and requests instead of listing all of the bad things that happened to someone you know. We challenge you to get "deep" with one-another relationally, which means becoming a little bit vulnerable as you are honest with one-another.

PRAY FOR THE MISSIONS OF THE WEEK:

WCC supports many wonderful missionaries and organizations all over the world. We are committed to support them with our finances as well as our prayers and encouragement. Ask God to work in their lives and through their ministries to ignite a passion for Jesus in others.

DAILY DEVOTION:

Be consistent, honest, and intentional with this time and you will not regret it. The whole point of this workbook is to make the sermons and Scriptures stick with you in your daily walk with Christ. Digging in to God's Word and applying it to your daily life is perhaps the best way to solidify His truth into your heart and your life.

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Week 9 - Communion

WEEK 9 - COMMUNION CONNECT QUESTIONS

- 1. When have you tried to do something good but it ended up getting you into more trouble?
- 2. What is the wildest thing you have eaten?
- 3. When have you experienced an especially memorable meal? What made it special?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. Read 1 Corinthians 10:16. What do you think it means to participate in the blood and body of Christ through communion?

2. Read 1 Corinthians 11:17-22. What were the Corinthians doing wrong? Why was Paul so upset with them?

3. In what ways do you think Churches or people today could be guilty of doing more harm than good when taking communion?

4. Read 1 Corinthians 11:23-26. Jesus said to take communion in remembrance of him. What are we to remember? Why do we need to do this each time?

5. Read 1 Corinthians 11:27-30. What may happen if we take communion in an unworthy manner? Why is this so serious?

6. What does it mean to examine ourselves before we take communion? How and why should we do this?

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. When have you been guilty of taking communion in an unworthy manner?
- 2. How will you take communion differently after this study?
- 3. What can you do to best prepare yourself before you take communion from now on?

PRAY FOR ONE-ANOTHER

PRAY FOR THE MISSION OF THE WEEK

Frontier Ministries

This is a NEW Ministry with WCC! Daniel & Kelsey H. are leaving this month for Northern Africa with their family where they will be reaching to a currently unreached Muslim people group. Due to the nature of their ministry and the safety of their family, this is all the information we are able to give.

DAILY DEVOTION [DAYS 1-3]

DAY 1:

"He personally carried our sins in his body on the cross so that we can be dead to sin and live for what is right. By his wounds you are healed."

[1 Peter 2:24, NLT]

DAY 2:

"But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed." [Isaiah 53:5, NIV]

- What do you think of when you take communion? What images come to your mind?
- This prophecy of Jesus occurred hundreds of years before Jesus was on earth. How does this bring deeper meaning to your times of communion?

DAY 3:

"⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴⁵Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts." [Acts 2:42, 46, NIV]

What are the two possibilities of what it means to break bread together? Why are both important for us to do as a church body?

- Stop right now to picture the image described above. Rest and meditate on that scene. Now thank God for your spiritual healing through his wounds.
- What did Jesus get? What do we get? Why do we need to remember both parts of this?
- What are the things they were devoted to and continued to do? How can you be more devoted and consistent with these things?

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DAILY DEVOTION [DAYS 4-6]

DAY 4:

"Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ?" [1 Corinthians 10:16, NIV]

DAY 5:

"Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf." [1 Corinthians 10:17, NIV]

DAY 6:

"So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord." [1 Corinthians 11:27, NIV]

- What do you think it means to participate in the blood and body of Christ?
- Why do you think Paul emphasizes one loaf to the church body?
- When have you taken communion out of habit, with a bad attitude, or in an unworthy manner?

- Why do you think Jesus' blood AND body are both emphasized with communion? How can you be sure to participate in both of these?
- We are not wrong by using individual wafers, but what can you [and WCC] do to emphasize Paul's purpose of writing this verse?
- How can you keep from doing this? What do you think a worthy manner looks like for communion?

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Week 10 - Discipleship

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WEEK 10 - DISCIPLESHIP CONNECT QUESTIONS

- 1. If you had to leave home and leave all of your belongings behind, what would you miss the most?
- 2. When have you had a disagreement with someone because you had different definitions of a word or term?
- 3. What are some things you have learned from a person that you would not have learned in a book?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. What do you think is meant by the quote "disciples are not made by accident"?

2. Jesus said "Follow me... and I will make you... fishers of men" [Matthew 4:19 ESV]. Explain the three parts of this command and how it relates to making disciples.

3. READ Matthew 4:18-22. What do you notice in verses 20 and 22 about the responses of these first disciples? How should that inspire us?

4. Read Luke 14:25-33. What illustrations does Jesus give about the cost of being a disciple? Explain each one.

5. Read Luke 14:33 again. What are some things that may get in the way of a person being a true disciple?

6. Read Matthew 16:24. Why do you think Jesus put conditions on being a disciple? Why would he need to explain what people were getting themselves into?

7. Read Matthew 28:18-20. How does this command from Jesus relate to his commands to his first disciples? [Refer to question 3]

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. What is holding you back from being a better disciple?
- 2. What is holding you back from making disciples?
- 3. How will you follow Jesus better? Grow to be more like him? Go to make more disciples?

PRAY FOR ONE-ANOTHER

[Spend some time praying with your Life Group. When asking for requests, try to keep the focus on personal praises/requests that relate to people in the group.]

DAILY DEVOTION [DAYS 1-3]

DAY 1:

"For God called you to do good, even if it means suffering, just as Christ suffered for you. He is your example, and you must follow in his steps."

[1 Peter 1:21, NLT]

DAY 2:

"Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.'" [Matthew 16:24, NIV]

DAY 3:

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"In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples." [Luke 14:33, NIV]

- A disciple is a growing follower and imitator of Jesus. How does this verse show that?
- Yesterday we saw that Jesus says we are to give up everything. Why would he also make this statement?
- This verse is at the end of many examples that Jesus gives of things that get in the way of being a disciple. What gets in your way?

- What are some possible ways disciples of Jesus may suffer today? How can you follow his example?
- When do you deny yourself? When have you indulged? What cross do you need to take up in order to follow Jesus?
- Why would Jesus be so harsh and demanding of his disciples? What would he say to you today?

DAILY DEVOTION [DAYS 4-6]

DAY 4:

"So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth." [Revelation 3:19, NIV] **DAY 5**:

"¹⁹Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." [Matthew 28:19-20a, NIV]

- Why is Jesus so harsh on people who are lukewarm? What kind of person do you think this looks like?
- Make disciples is the main verb in this command. How are the others related to this?

DAY 6:

"¹⁸Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ... ²⁰And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.'" [Matthew 28:19-20a, NIV]

Why does Jesus want us to know about his authority? How does he relinquish authority to us through his command to make disciples?

- Have you been guilty of being a lukewarm or mediocre Christian? What would it take for you to be hot/on fire/ignited for Jesus?
- Discipleship is very interesting in that we are both followers and leaders. Whom are you following? Whom are you leading or discipling?
- Why would Jesus reassure us that he will always be with us? How does this help you as a disciple and a disciple maker?

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Week 11 - Evangelism

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WEEK 11 - EVANGELISM CONNECT QUESTIONS

- 1. When have you been so excited about something you just had to tell everyone you know?
- 2. What are some examples of good news that people usually share with everyone they know?
- 3. When have you been asked a question you were unprepared to answer? [Every week at Life Group...right? Ha!]

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. When you think of the word evangelism, who and what comes to your mind?

2. After hearing the sermon, what is your definition or concept of evangelism now?

3. How was the lesson on discipleship last week related to evangelism this week?

4. What are some reasons people may be hesitant or resistant to evangelism? How does Romans 10:14-15 give you encouragement and urgency?

5. Read 1 Peter 3:13-18. How do these verses give encouragement and help to alleviate some of the fears people have with evangelism?

6. Read Matthew 28:18-20. How do these verses relate to evangelism and discipleship?

- 7. In March we learned about the salvation process we see in the Bible. Go through these steps again and discuss how you would explain each of these to a person who asked you about how to become a follower of Jesus.
 - a. Hear [Romans 10:14; 10:17]
 - b. Believe [John 3:16; Acts 2:36-37]
 - c. Confess [Acts 19:18; Romans 10:9]
 - d. Repent [Acts 3:19]
 - e. Be Baptized [Acts 2:38; 1 Peter 3:21]
 - f. Remain Faithful [1 Corinthians 15:2; Revelation 2:10]

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. During the sermon and during this lesson, who came to your mind that needs to hear and accept the Gospel message?
- 2. In what practical ways can you evangelize to these people, and others in your life?
- 3. When and how will you be a light to those around you? How will you be prepared to give an answer to the hope you have?
- 4. Pray for the lost. Mention them by name (if you are comfortable with it). Pray that God will use you or send another believer to reach these people.

PRAY FOR THE MISSION OF THE WEEK

Outreach International - Mexico | Josh & Susan Sanchez

This mission, called Me & My House Ministries, is a church plant in Colima City. Their goal is to begin a church planting movement within the region.

DAILY DEVOTION [DAYS 1-3]

DAY 1:

"But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect," [1 Peter 3:15, NIV]

What scares you the most about sharing your faith with someone else? Have you ever had a bad experience doing this?

DAY 2:

"Let your conversation be gracious and attractive so that you will have the right response for everyone." [Colossians 4:6, NIV]

DAY 3:

"When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." [Matthew 9:36, NIV]

- Why would our words and conversations need to be gracious and attractive when we are evangelizing? What can happen if we are not?
- Jesus looked over Jerusalem and wept because they were lost? Who do you have compassion for because they are lost?

- How can you prepare yourself to give an answer for the hope and faith you have?
- When have you said or [posted something online!] that may make it difficult to then share the Gospel with someone who saw that?
- What should that compassion lead you to do to those individuals or groups of people? How can you help them find the Good Shepherd?

[1 Corinthians 9:22, NIV]

DAY 6.

"¹⁴How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? ¹⁵And how can anyone preach unless they are sent?"

[Romans 10:14-15a, NIV]
