Feel free to answer these questions out loud when your leader reads them or you can quietly reflect and write a response in your workbook.

PRAY FOR ONE-ANOTHER:


Please focus this time on *your own personal* praises and requests instead of listing all of the bad things that happened to someone you know. We challenge you to get "deep" with one-another relationally, which means becoming a little bit vulnerable as you are honest with one-another.

2. Read John 4:1-6. Why do you think Jesus chose to travel through Samaria? What was strange about this?

3. Read John 4:7-15. What might the Samaritan woman have thought when she came to the well in the middle of the day and found a Jewish man sitting next to it?

4.	How might the woman have felt having a conversation at the town well?
5.	The Samaritan woman and Jesus have two different ideas about "living water." What were they? Why was the living water Jesus described attractive to the woman?
6.	Read John 4:16-26. Why was the woman avoiding people? Why do you think she had so many husbands? What might she be seeking in these relationships?
7.	How does Jesus exhibit both truth and grace in this conversation? How are his arms wider than ours?

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. When have you felt like you are not good enough for Jesus? How does this story speak against this feeling?
- 2. How do we open our arms wider to those who are outcasts? What are ways we can express love to the outcast?
- 3. Who might be that person in your life today that needs to be loved and accepted?

1. If you read Scripture, from Genesis to Revelation, there is no denying that God has a heart for those who are poor and those who are oppressed. What keeps people from having a heart for those who are poor or in need?

2. Read Mark 10:46-48. Why do you suppose Bartimaeus had to beg? What does referring to Jesus as the "Son of David" mean?

3. Why did the crowd rebuke Bartimaeus? What would you have done?

4.	Read Mark 10:49-50. Why do you think Jesus stopped? Why did Jesus say "call him"?
5.	Read Mark 10:51-52. Jesus asks, "What do you want me to do for you?" His disability would have been obvious and Jesus knew his heart as well. So, why ask the question? Why not just heal him?
6.	Jesus heals Bartimaeus and says, "Go"but what does Bartimaeus do? Why?

2. Read Luke 19:1-6. Why is it important for Luke to mention that Zacchaeus was a tax collector? What stories can you recall of Jesus and his interactions with other tax collectors? How did the people of that time feel about tax collectors?

3. Why do you think Zacchaeus wanted to see Jesus?

4.	Jesus spots Zacchaeus in the tree and calls him by namehow would you describe Jesus at this moment? Read Luke 19:7. Jesus then invites himself to Zacchaeus's housewhy was this an issue?
5.	Read Luke 19:8-10. How does Zacchaeus repent or turn around in these verses?

2. Read Mark 10:13-16. Why do you think people were bringing their children to Jesus? Why do you think the disciples rebuked these parents?

3. How were children often viewed in ancient culture?

4.	What word describes Jesus' reaction to his disciples? What did he command those around him to do? How are Jesus' arms wider at this moment?
5.	Read Matthew 25:31-46 (or have someone tell the group what the passage is about). Who are the "least of these", undervalued, and inconvenient people in our society today? How do we begin to open our arms wider? (give time for your group to answer these two questions really well).
6.	Going back to Mark 10:13-16, how can you become like one of these children?
7.	Read Philippians 2:1-11. Obviously, Jesus is our example when it comes to loving others and opening our arms up wide. Which part of this passage is difficult for you? Why?

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. Consider the person with whom you have a difficult time. How could you show love to them this week?
- 2. Identify the things you struggle with the most in dealing with others (patience, annoyance, judgements, humility, etc). Spend time praying for transformation.
- 3. Set a time or look for an opportunity to reach out to someone God has placed on your heart. When can you seize an opportunity this week and trust that God can use you and your arms wide open to be Jesus to someone?
