- Read the Student Core52 book with your teenage or elementary children



CONNECT QUESTIONS

- 2. Incarnation means that Jesus "took on flesh." What would have been different or difficult about that?
- 3. How does our belief in the incarnation bring us together or unite us?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

- 1. Read John 1:1-5. Now read it again, but this time substitute "Jesus" for "the Word." What are some important beliefs about Jesus that are confirmed by this passage?
- 2. Read John 1:6-13. This passage talks about "John the Baptist" being the forerunner for Jesus, a witness and messenger that the Kingdom of God was near. Vs. 10-11 says that the world didn't recognize Jesus or accept him. Why do you think they failed to do so?
- 3. Read John 1:12 again. How does our belief in Jesus and our receiving of Jesus change us? How does it Unite us?
- 4. Read John 1:14. How is this verse foundational to our faith? How was Jesus "full of grace and truth"?

- 3. How is being united an act of love? How does division work against love?
- 4. Read Matthew 22:34-40. We are commanded to love God with all of our heart, soul, and mind. What does that look like?

- 3. What does it mean to worship in Spirit and in truth?

CONNECT QUESTIONS

- 1. What are some things you do to help to remember something? (ie. write a note)
- 2. What team building activities have you participated in? What are they for? How do they help?
- 3. How have you participated in Communion, or the Lord's Supper, throughout your life?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. Who can give us a short explanation of what Communion is and how we practice Communion at Wentzville Christian Church?

2. Read Matthew 26:26-30. How would you describe what Jesus established with his disciples at this moment?

3. How would communion become a moment of unity for the disciples and the early church and help bring them together?

4. While Jesus established Communion to unite us in remembrance of him, eventually some churches struggled to uphold the value and importance of taking communion in the right manner. Read 1 Corinthians 11:20-33. What seems to be the problem?

JUNE 11 | WEEK 36 | ETERNAL SECURITY [JOHN 10:28] **CONNECT QUESTIONS**

- 1. What are some things you do in your home to make you feel secure?
- 2. How does uncertainty in life affect you? How does it make you feel?
- 3. How can you maintain unity with others if you disagree about things?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

- Eternal Security has been a divisive issue in the Church throughout history. Different groups believe different things and there are wise and godly people on both sides of this issue. In the book Core 52, Moore asks that we "commit to wrestle with the text, not with one another." Are we able to agree to that as we move forward today?
- 2. Read John 10:22-30. What does Jesus explain that brings you hope? What conditions does he give about his "sheep"?

- 3. Read John 6:37. Jesus says that everyone who comes to him will never be rejected. For some on the "once saved, always saved" side of things, this verse says a lot! How does this verse bring hope to you today?
- 4. Read Romans 8:38-39. Nothing can separate us from the love of God that is in Jesus! That's amazing! What does this say about God's love and faithfulness? How can we be united in this?

5. Good so far? Here comes the tension - Read Hebrews 6:4-6. The author of Hebrews describes those who were believers, even having the Holy Spirit, who have now "fallen away." What does that tell us?

6. Read John 15:5-6. We see the tension between "once saved, always saved" and the other extreme, "always trying, never sure." The Bible indicates we must stand firm in our faith, we must follow and remain in Jesus, and as we do, we don't have to live in fear that our salvation is in question. What does it mean to "remain" in Jesus? What does Jesus say about those who don't remain in him?

7. We should absolutely be filled with hope and assurance because of our faith in Christ! We should also be challenged to live according to the word of God while remaining firm in our faith! That's the tension. How does this promote unity?

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. How can I trust God's Word and the hope and assurance I have of salvation?
- 2. Who is someone I can encourage this week who is having a hard time?
- 3. What are some healthy ways for me to continue to remain in Jesus?

JUNE 28 | WEEK 37 | HOLY SPIRIT [ACTS 1:8]

CONNECT QUESTIONS

- 1. When have you helped someone accomplish something?
- 2. When was the last time you either gave comfort to someone or received comfort from someone?
- 3. Why does the Holy Spirit seem mysterious?

COMMUNITY DISCUSSION

1. Read Acts 1:8. How would the Holy Spirit help the apostles and disciples share the gospel with the world?

2. Read John 14:15-17. In this teaching, Jesus explains the Holy Spirit to his disciples. What can we learn about the Holy Spirit from this passage?

3. How does having the Holy Spirit unite us as believers?

- 4. Look up the following passages and determine some ways the Holy Spirit can help us:
 - a. John 16:7-8
 - d. Ephesians 1:17-20
- b. 1 Corinthians 3:16
- e. John 16:13-15
- c. 1 Corinthians 2:10-11
- f. 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

- 5. Obviously the Holy Spirit does so much more within us and within the church. One of the roles of the Holy Spirit is to produce godly character in our lives. Read Galatians 5:16-21. How can we "walk by the Spirit"? Read through the "acts of the flesh." Paul says they are obvious. Do you agree with that statement?
- 6. Read Galatians 5:22-26. How is the Holy Spirit trying to develop your character? How does the fruit of the Spirit lead to unity?
- 7. What do you think it means to "keep in step with the Spirit"?
- 8. How does the Holy Spirit help us reach others with the gospel?

CHANGE QUESTIONS

- 1. What is something that you could use the Holy Spirit's guidance on today? How will you seek God's wisdom for you?
- 2. What actions can you take to be more in step with the Spirit?
- 3. Think about some current conflict or tension (even minor things with our kids). How could the fruit of the Spirit be exhibited in your response?
